






## THE HOLY CHILD









This project is fairly simple to complete, and shouldn't take you much time. The Holy Child portion of the carving is a good example of relief work, that is, creating the illusion of depth without really going that deep at all.

The Child's face has very minimal features, yet an expression of peaceful contentment is obvious. This is not hard at all to accomplish when the facial elements are correctly placed. Sometimes simplicity says much more than detail would. How ironic it is that the most simplistic piece in the whole Nativity project is the most important conceptually!

When band-sawing out the blank, be sure to cut out the voids that define the manger's feet before cutting the angled sides. The easiest way to define the angles is to saw the blank while standing it on end. Then follow the end view pattern. If you don't want to deal with this, simply eliminate the feet and go with a flat bottom.

Your block before sawing will need to measure 1  $^1/_4$  " x 1  $^1/_4$  " x 3  $^1/_4$  ".

Basswood block 1 1/4" x 1 1/4" x 3 1/4"
Standard carving knife
Fine detail knife
#12 3/8" v-tool
#12 1/8" v-tool
#11 1/4" half-round gouge
Very small veiner gouge
1/8" shallow gouge
1/4" shallow gouge
1/2" fishtail gouge
Pencil or fine marker
Band saw
Carving glove or thumb tape
for protection

## Materials List: Painting and Finishing

1/2" flat brush for large areas
1/4" round brush for smaller areas
1/8" round brush
Raw sienna
Antique white
Corn yellow
Flesh tone
Bright red
Medium gray
Fast drying satin polyurethane
Brown gel wood stain
Disposable stain brush
Cotton rag
