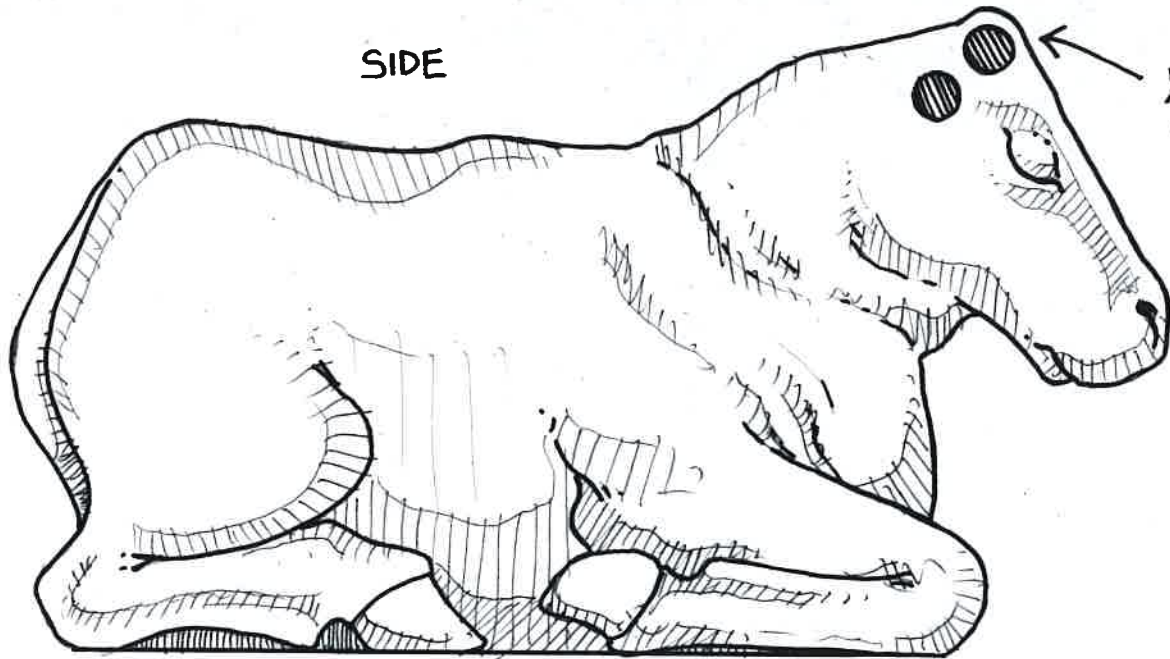

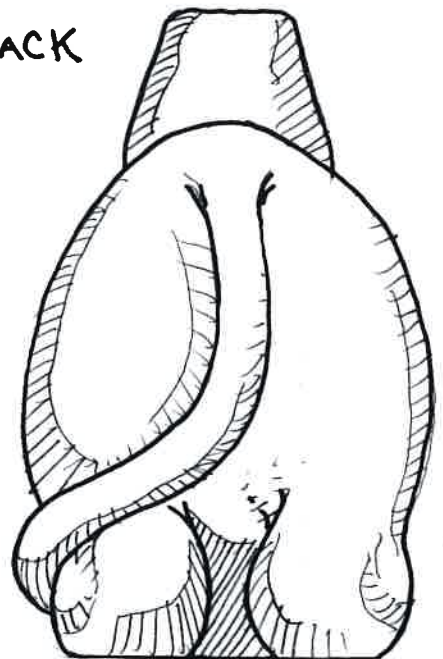

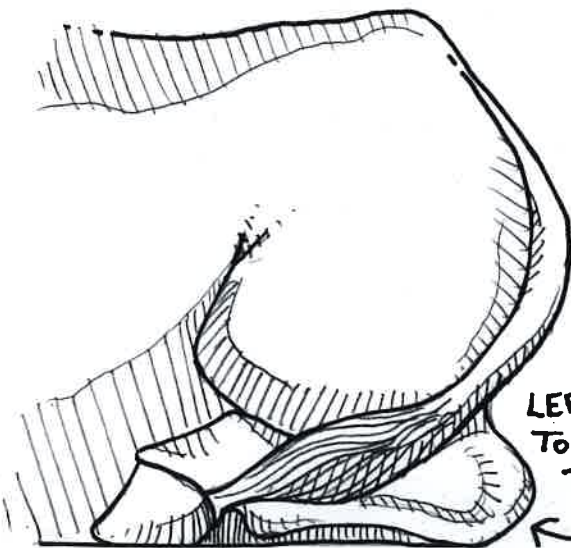

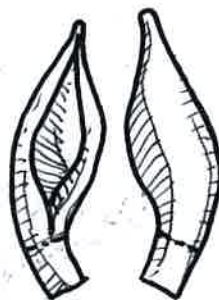

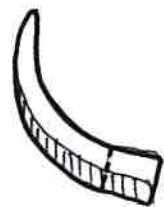

**T**he ox, or bull, is a fairly easy design to carve. I chose to add the ears and the horns separately. If you tried to carve them as one piece, they would most likely snap off due to cross grain. After the ox is carved out, drill  $\frac{1}{4}$ " holes according to the pattern. Once you have carved the ears and horns, simply glue them in place. Be sure to study the photos for correct placement. The horns should be tilted forward, rather than straight up, so they follow the neckline. The block measures  $6" \times 2 \frac{1}{4}" \times 3 \frac{1}{2}"$ . The ears and horns are carved from  $\frac{1}{4}$ "-thick stock. Be sure the grain runs length-wise.
